



### Program Description

The Safe Communities Institute, (formerly DCI), is offering the Executive Leadership Program (ELP), which provides senior leaders with a 21<sup>st</sup> Century approach to public safety by adopting a multidisciplinary and “whole-of-community” methodology.

The program is a *one* week-long course that is intended to challenge international public safety leaders and enhance their analysis, coordination, and response capabilities to the evolving threats to public safety in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. Structured specifically for public sector professionals and policymakers, it employs an interdisciplinary academic and experiential learning environment. Participants strengthen their cross-functional skills through immersion in key issues and best practices presented by world-class researchers, policy experts, and practitioners in public safety. The ELP is intended for senior leaders from the United States and abroad.

### Admission Requirements

The ELP invites senior leaders with executive or command level responsibilities from public safety backgrounds including law enforcement, fire, health, social work, government and education. Admission is selective and based on professional achievement and organizational responsibility.

#### Curriculum

Public safety in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century requires a holistic approach and public trust. Effective leadership and collaboration between public safety disciplines and the community are essential to meet the complex challenges facing society today. The distinctive approaches of the ELP curriculum work to strengthen senior leaders cross-functional skills through immersion in key issues and best practices.

ELP integrates classroom instruction and experiential learning opportunities. With visits to sites that augment the curriculum, senior leaders study and observe real world examples of topics and concepts presented in the classroom. Sites will include a California State Prison, an innovative technology laboratory, Long Beach Port, and communities struggling to decrease violence.
