## CONTROL OBJECTIVES

### Fire and Salvage

- Provide for the control and mitigation of all fire-associated hazards
- Locate and extinguish fires
- Contain fire to XX floor
- Continue firefighting operations
- Contain, extinguish, and overhaul the fire
- Contain spread of fire to....
- Conduct damage/stability assessment
- Develop and implement a salvage plan
- Demobilize excess companies
- Secure utilities
- Conduct damage/stability assessment
- Develop and implement a salvage plan
- Conduct overhaul operations to ensure extinguishment of the fire
- Restore, control and maintain access, vital infrastructure and utilities; identify isolate and stabilize all structures that pose a threat to responders, the public and the community.

### Brush Fire

- Using direct attack, keep the fire...
- Patrol fire line throughout all Divisions for hot spots and/or flare-ups
- Extinguish all flair-ups
- Prevent Damage to structures from approaching fire (structure protection)
- Provide and maintain lookouts throughout operational period
- Identify and report safety hazards to be addressed in the next operational period
- Maintain inner/outer perimeter
- Conduct damage/stability assessment
- Provide structure protection (defense) for the communities of:
- Minimize damage to the natural resource areas (Local, State, and Federal)
- Continue to provide for the protection of property in the communities of XXX commensurate with the threat.
- Follow the standards and guidelines to minimize conflicts with the following threatened and endangered species:
- On a daily basis, continue to assess suppression and rehabilitation needs and appropriately scale down assigned resources to manage costs.

- Implement rehab needs for suppression actions at locations no longer needed for fire control.
- Identify and meet the Unit's requirements for fire suppression repair
- Patrol assigned divisions: identify, isolate and extinguish hot spot adjacent to control lines to distances identified in the mop-up standards.
- Begin mopping up identified hot spots within 200 feet of the fires edge that may threaten established lines.
- As opportunities become available, begin implementing the suppression rehabilitation plan.
- Minimize acreage burned while adhering to all Management and Operational Objectives.
- Minimize impacts from suppression activities along...
- Provide for the protection of the threatened and endangered species and identified cultural resources.
- Contain Fire To Wildland Operational Area 82-9.
- Provide fire the protection of threatened and endangered species.
- Provide for the protection of archeological and cultural sites.
- Provide for infrastructure protection.

#### Law Enforcement

- **Maintain civil order and provide for security and investigation.**
- Maintain perimeter security and remove unauthorized persons from restricted areas
- Ensure safe movement of event attendees, crowd control.
- Deploy law enforcement resources to deter criminal activity.
- Close streets as needed to maintain crowd safety, and maintain perimeter control.
- Provide a pre-staged law enforcement special operations group to ensure a rapid response to a potential terrorist attack.
- Provide law enforcement protection for evacuated communities
- Provide law enforcement for traffic control and incident safety
- Establish and maintain enforcement of safety/security zones
- Establish incident security plan including credentialing and other scene control measures
- Ensure coordinated effort is in place for investigation, evidence collection, storage, and security
- Ensure witness/victim management procedure is in place
- Search for suspects/occupants
- Establish hard perimeter
- Sweep facilities
- Provide force protection for first responders
- Maintain security
- Monitor crash site
- Maintain inner/outer perimeter
- Establish investigation group
- Interview and investigate suspects and witnesses
- Implement and maintain close interagency relationships in a Unified Command setting
- Protect constitutional rights.
- Provide law enforcement protection to the evacuated communities, traffic control and incident security.
- Provide law enforcement protection for evacuated communities.
- Provide law enforcement for traffic control and incident safety.
- Take those actions necessary to resume normal commerce and traffic in the area
- Assist Local, State and Federal law enforcement agencies with investigation, evidence collection, and security of the effected area.
- Establish and maintain a secure perimeter not less than 1,000 feet in all directions from the storage site.

### Search and Rescue

- **Provide for search and rescue of the trapped and missing; contain, control, mitigate all fires and hazardous substances.**
- Account for all affected responders and civilians
- Locate and evaluate all victims
- Search for victims
- Conduct joint agency SAR efforts
- Search for suspects/occupants
- Conduct a systematic search and rescue for all victims.

### Transportation Management

- **Restore, control, and maintain access, vital infrastructure, and utilities; identify, isolate, and stabilize all structures that pose a safety threat to responders, the public, and the community.**
- Conduct roadway assessment and establish priorities for facilitating commerce
- Establish and maintain coordination for possible movement of State/Federal/Local assets
- Develop and secure dedicated emergency access/egress routes

### Medical

- **Provide for the public's safety, health, welfare and security by treating the sick and injured, managing fatalities and providing for the orderly evacuation and care of the displaced and their animals.**
- Provide ALS and BLS treatment, support and necessary transportation.
- Provide medical treatment
- Establish and maintain a medical group
- Provide for the triage, treatment and transportation for the victims affected.

### Evacuation

- Coordinate and keep current evacuation plans and provide information to displaced parties
- Provide for the timely evacuation of people and animals in the threatened communities of
- Establish necessary evacuation sites/shelters of people and animals
- Establish evacuation area
- Establish and maintain safe refuge area, evacuation center, and reunification area
- Provide for the timely evacuation of threatened communities and set up the necessary evacuation sites.
- Evacuate citizen from impacted areas.
- Establish Evacuation Center Operations at XXX School
- Provide for the establishment and support of evacuation centers.
- Provide for the timely evacuation of people and animals in the threatened communities.
- Establish necessary evacuation sites/shelters of people and animals.
- Develop and implement an Evacuation Plan for all citizens within the incident perimeter.

### Hazardous Materials/Environmental

- Provide a multi-agency Haz-Mat group to rapidly determine the presence of, and abatement plan for any hazardous material release.
- Provide a pre-staged decontamination group as a progressive approach to a potential hazardous material release.
- Ensure control of the source and minimize release of the product
- Determine projected effect of product and identify sensitive area(s)
- Develop strategies for protection
- Develop and implement a plan to effectively contain, clean-up, recover, and dispose of spill product
- Ensure continuous monitoring of impact zone
- Identify Haz Mat issues

- Maintain inner/outer perimeter
- Assess as Haz Mat problem and report to IC immediately
- Interior LAFD FPB personnel shall report all relevant and measurable data to HazMat Group
- Utilize LAPD in non-IDLH areas for evacuation of ambulatory to MODEC for decon determination
- Utilize LAFD and LAPD HazMat Groups for level A entry and Rapid Assessment
- Conduct rapid extraction
- Provide for gross decon utilizing master streams
- Establish perimeter control, secure crime scene
- Conduct overhaul operations to ensure extinguishment of the fire and consumption/stabilization of the hazardous materials.
- Develop and implement a plan to effectively contain and clean up any hazardous materials

#### Release Of Chemical, Radiological, or Biological Agent

- Assess as Haz Mat problem and report to IC
- Interior LAFD FPB personnel shall report all relevant and measurable data to Haz Mat Group
- Utilize LAPD in non-IDLH areas for evacuation of ambulatory to MODEC for decon determination
- Utilize LAFD and LAPD Haz Mat Groups for level A entry and Rapid Assessment
- Rapid extraction to be performed at direction of Fire Branch Director
- Provide for gross decon utilizing master streams
- All patients fully deconned prior to delivery to Medical Group. Proper decon procedures shall be provided by Haz Mat Group
- Establish perimeter control, secure crime scene
- Stabilize and monitor

#### (Academy Awards 2009) Control

- Ensure safe movement of event attendees, crowd control.
- Deploy law enforcement resources to deter criminal activity.
- Close streets as needed to maintain crowd safety, and maintain perimeter control.
- Provide a pre-staged law enforcement special operations group to ensure a rapid response to a potential terrorist attack.
- Provide for the control and mitigation of all fire-associated hazards.
- Provide ALS and BLS treatment, support and necessary transportation.
- Provide a multi-agency Haz-Mat group to rapidly determine the presence of, and abatement plan for any hazardous material release.
- Provide a pre-staged decontamination group as a progressive approach to a potential hazardous material release.

#### (L.A. Marathon 2009) Control

- Ensure safe movement of event attendees.
- Provide passive and active crowd control measures.
- Deploy law enforcement resources to deter criminal activity.
- Close streets as needed to maintain crowd safety, and maintain perimeter control.
- Provide a pre-staged law enforcement special operations group to ensure a rapid response to a potential terrorist attack.
- Provide for the mitigation control of all fire-associated hazards.

- Provide Advance Life Support (ALS) and Basic Life Support (BLS) treatment, support and necessary transportation.
- Establish and maintain rehabilitation areas for heat-impacted participants.
- Provide a multi-agency Haz-Mat group to rapidly assess and abate any hazardous material release.
- Provide a pre-staged decontamination group to augment the response of a hazardous material release.

(Haskel 2004)

- Establish and maintain a secure perimeter not less than 1,000 feet in all directions from the storage site.
- Take those actions necessary to render safe the storage site, pre-ignition.
- Establish and maintain control of traffic on city streets, freeways, railways and airspace immediate to the perimeter.
- Develop and implement an Evacuation Plan for all citizens within the incident perimeter.
- Conduct a controlled burn of the storage site to neutralize the hazardous materials.
- Take those actions necessary to render safe the storage site, post-ignition.
- Conduct overhaul operations to ensure extinguishment of the fire and consumption/stabilization of the hazardous materials.
- Take those actions necessary to resume normal commerce and traffic in the area

(Allen Memorial 2011)

#### MANAGEMENT

- Ensure safety of all participants, attendees, and event personnel.
- Provide a memorial that honors FF/PM Allen in the highest traditions of the Fire Service.
- Ensure the wishes of FF/PM Allen's family are recognized and honored.
- Provide support for FF/PM Allen's immediate and Fire Department family during this time of need.
- Maintain fiscal responsibility during all phases of this event
- Ensure public information is accurate and timely.

#### CONTROL

- Provide a procession that incorporates FF/PM Allen's family, Fire Department family and City family.
- Provide a memorial service that honors and memorializes FF/PM Allen in the highest tradition.
- Provide a reception that honors FF/PM Allen.
- Treat, transport and track any medical patients generated during this event.

## **MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES**

### 2011 Brush Management

- Provide for first responder, public and assisting agencies safety through strict adherence to LCES and standard policies and procedures.
- Provide for the timely and accurate release of current and predicted fire information to the media, public, and government agencies.
- Develop a plan to ensure communication and coordination with appropriate stakeholders and assisting agencies
- Assure funds expended by the ICT 9 are cost effective to the values at risk.
- Minimize damage to the natural resource areas (Local, State, and Federal) through Minimum Impact Suppression Tactics (M.I.S.T.) principles.
- Provide for the safety of the public and emergency responders.
- Provide for responder and evacuee safety.
- Ensure responder first responder safety.

- Provide for the safety and welfare of all responders and assisting agencies.
- Provide for responders' safety, health, welfare and security.
- Manage a coordinated interagency response effort that reflects the make-up of Unified Command.
- Establish an approved IMT organization that can effectively meet the initial and long term challenges required to mitigate the incident.
- Identify all appropriate agency/organization mandates, practices, and protocols for inclusion in the overall response effort.
- Identify and minimize social, political, and economic adverse effects.
- Implement a coordinate response with law enforcement and other responding agencies including MCEs.
- Evaluate all planned actions to determine potential impacts on social, political, and economic entities.
- Identify competing response activities (LE and Mitigating) to ensure that they are closely coordinated.
- Manage costs commensurate with values at risk.
- Keep public informed of fire progress.
- Provide structure protection of developed properties.
- Maintain multi-agency command center.
- Provide for responder safety and rehabilitation.
- Establish a joint information center and provide public information.
- Establish a unified public information plan.
- Continue documentation as necessary.
- Identify all appropriate agency/organization mandates, practices, and protocols for inclusion in the overall response effort
- Ensure M.I.S.T. Tactics are followed
- Minimize damage to the natural resource areas (Local, State, and Federal) through Minimum Impact Suppression Tactics (M.I.S.T.) principles.

### **Safety Officer**

- Develop a site safety plan, including support facilities
- Monitor safety plan for compliance
- Report any serious incidents, accidents, or injuries immediately to command
- Provide for the safety and welfare of citizens and response personnel
- Identify safety and risk management factors and monitor for compliance for both the public and responders
- Conduct Operational Risk Assessment and ensure controls are in place to protect responders and the public.
- Provide for safety of all incident personnel and the public in the execution of all incident operations. Review and integrate the "10 Standard Firefighting Orders" and the "18 Situations that Shout Watch-out" into all incident operations.
- Provide for the safety of all incident personnel and the public by recognizing and mitigating risks identified in LCES, the 10 Standard Fire Orders, and 18 Watch Out Situations before implementing any tactical actions.
- Provide for firefighter and public safety through strict adherence to LCES and standard firefighting policies and procedures.

### **Public Information Officer**

- Develop a media strategy
- Locate and establish a JIC
- Provide talking points to Command for press briefings, VIP visits and town hall meetings
- Prepare for press conference
- Continue to provide timely and accurate information to the XXX and the affected communities.
- Provide for the timely and accurate release of current and predicted fire information to the media, public, and government agencies.

### **Liaison Officer**

- Develop a plan to ensure communication and coordination with appropriate stakeholders and assisting agencies
- Keep Command informed of any stakeholder adverse feelings/relationships that may develop.
- Work in conjunction with the media through information officers and community liaisons
- Maintain close working relationship with the public and forest visitors – keeping them informed of the status of the fire and its effect on them.
- Ensure compliance with the agency administrator and stakeholders priorities

### **Intelligence Officer**

- Identify critical intelligence needs
- Develop intelligence flow plan and brief IMT
- Be the central point of coordination for all interagency intelligence organizations
- Field Intelligence Support Teams Joint Terrorism Task Forces
- Intelligence Fusion Centers, etc...
- Screen intelligence information for OPSEC/Security Sensitive Information (SSI) classification

### **Planning**

- Ensure that all off-site information reporting is approved by Command prior to release
- Develop a contingency plan for sustaining long-term IMT staffing
- Brief IMT staff on document control system, including handling and storing secure documents
- Provide all documents that need review or approval by Command at least one hour prior to implementation or release

### **Logistics**

- Develop and brief the IMT on the internal/external resource ordering process
- Monitor for compliance
- Ensure that appropriate security is established at incident support facilities
- Develop and establish a secure communications plan for both internal and external use and brief the IMT staff.

### **Finance/Admin**

- **Ensure compliance with the agency administrator and the stakeholders priorities.**
- Provide Command with a summary cost estimate
- Establish a claims system and brief the IMT on the process
- Advise Command of unusual high cost (i.e. specialized equipment use, workers comp issues, etc.)
